- ◇ Approximately 2,800 children in grades PreK through 12

## Our Staff

- ◇ 43% of the division's professional staff have a masters or doctoral degree.
- ◇ 98% of our professional teaching staff are considered "highly qualified."
- ◇ 100% of our teachers and administrators are focused on student achievement and student success!!
- ◇ Greene County Public Schools has 5 Nationally Board Certified Teachers

## Academic Offerings

- ◇ William Monroe High School offers 12 Advanced Placement courses serving 142 students in 2007-2008.
- ◇ Greene County elementary and middle schools offer enrichment and intervention opportunities daily.
- ◇ 176 students received dual-enrollment college credit.
- ◇ Greene County is implementing a math timeline to ensure that by 2014 all 8th graders will be enrolled in Algebra I.
- ◇ All core area subjects and grade levels participate in a standardized benchmark assessment program
- ◇ Standardized curriculum and pacing guides for each grade level

## Community Organizations Supporting Greene County Public Schools:

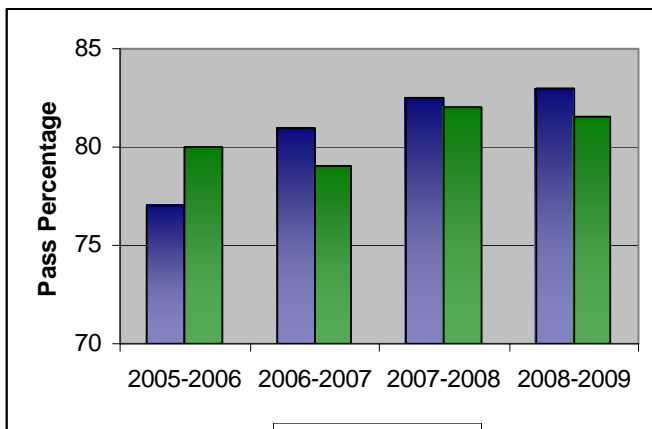
**GREEN Group** (Greene Residents for Excellence in Education Now): organization that supports school building projects and budget priorities, and shares parent concerns and suggestions with the superintendent and school board.

**Greene County Athletic Foundation:** ongoing goal is facility improvement. The GCAF is currently building a new \$400,000 field house for all GCPS athletes.

**Greene County Educational Foundation:** provides scholarships for students and grants for teachers to promote innovation in the classroom.

**GAPP** (Greene Area Preschool Partnership) partnership with the goals of maintaining ongoing collaboration, leveling the instructional "playing field" for all students, provide staff development for teachers, and provide tangible resources when possible.

## Successes

- ◇ The class of 2009 received \$791,400 in scholarships.
- ◇ 74% of the class of 2009 will continue their formal education after high school.
- ◇ 39 students earned at least 15 college credits at WMHS.
- ◇ 91% graduation rate in 2008-2009
- ◇ Two Greene County teachers were selected to participate on the 2009 VDOE SOL Assessment Review Committee (Kirsten Dexter, WMHS; Mary Cave, WMMS)
- ◇ RES teacher Donna Shifflett was chosen to present at the National Conference of History Educators in Boston, Massachusetts.
- ◇ Hope Harlow and Diane Kenney were recognized as Educators of the Year for the 2008-2009 school year.
- ◇ A five-year, \$1.7 million Teaching American History Grant was awarded to GCS in partnership with surrounding counties.
